When TBLI started seven years ago, there was little significant activity in the field of sustainable investment. England had started to take SRI investments seriously and there was also some activity in The Netherlands. For the rest of Europe, SRI investments were at the very beginning stages. Now, seven years later, it is hard to find a major financial institution that is not taking a serious look at TBLI (triple bottom line investing).
